It is estimated that there is approximately 1.5 billion people online, a large segment of which are children, pre-teens, teens, and young adults. In a recent published Canadian research paper called, "Young Canadians in a Wired World", 99% of youth interviewed stated that they had surfed the Internet, and 78% stated that they have home access to the World Wide Web. When you consider the fact that in the year 2000 the FBI found at least 23,000 child pornography sites, 420 million pages of pornography, and over 500,000 online photos showing sexual acts involving minors, it becomes obvious that we need to be educated on Internet safety.

On **December 2, 2010** Woodlands Secondary will be presenting Mr. Darren Laur of Personal Protection Systems. Mr. Laur is a nationally recognized expert in safety awareness and self-protection strategies. This free presentation is open to parents and the community at **7:00 PM in the Gym (Doors open at 6:30)**.

CANADA/FRANCE EXCHANGE

2011/2012 OSEF

Junior High/High School Students from 13-17 years old



Participate in a reciprocal exchange in France. Host your French partner, live with a French family and attend school the following year.

The next meeting will be in January of 2011 at Dover Bay or see Mme Mazzarotto if you are interested.

Applications close on May 15, 2011

Individual Reciprocal Exchanges for 4,9 and 11 weeks.

The French students are in Canada from August to October or November (depending on the arrival date).

The Canadian students are in France from February to May (depending on the arrival date). For the one month program, Canadian students are in France for July and return at the end of July with their exchange partner to spend August in Canada.

Students attend an orientation session during a weekend in May or June in order to prepare for successful exchange. The program includes 2 days of visits and orientation in Paris (the Eiffel Tower, a boat ride on the Seine River, Notre Dame and the Champs Elysees avenue, and accommodation in a hotel).

September/October: the French students attend their partner's school and at the end of the exchange students receive a school report from their Junior or Senior High School. The partners and their families are selected according to interest, age, and personal activities. The students are covered by a health and repatriation insurance with Europ Assistance.

The principal's permission is compulsory to take part in the 9 or 11 week exchange www.osef.ca

TRADES AND CERTIFICATE TRAINING AVAILABLE IN OUR SCHOOL DISTRICT!

Why the trades? The Industrial Training Authority predicts that there will be significant shortages of well-paid skilled trade workers in the next five years. There are more people retiring than there are people to replace them. Students with Post-Secondary Trades Training and/or apprenticeships will be poised to get interesting and well paid jobs. Trades are an excellent choice for students who like working with their hands to fix and make things.

Our school district offers two programs that support students interested in or already active in pursuing a career in the trades.

SD 68's Career Technical Centre (CTC)

Through School District 68's CTC program, students can access 13 different post-secondary trades and technical training programs in their grade 12 year. Successful applicants will have their tuition for these post-secondary programs paid in full. Students will earn both high school and university credits for these programs.

Secondary School Apprenticeship (SSA)

The Secondary School Apprenticeship program allows students to earn high school credits for trades-related work. It requires students to be sponsored by a certified trade person at a registered WCB worksite. Many students may already be in a position to benefit from this program – they are referred to as “hidden” apprentices.

Students in this program can earn four courses (a total of 16 elective course credits) at the grade 11 and 12 level; one course for each 120 hours worked. Upon successful completion of the SSA program students may earn a \$1000 scholarship.
