COUNSELING DEPT. – Mr. Christianson **Graduation Transitions (GT)**

All grade 12 students are required to complete GT in grade 12 as a ministry grad requirement. Students must complete their GT package and schedule an interview with their GT advisor in order to get credit for GT.

If students have not completed this by Friday April 15th, they will receive an Incomplete on their April report card, and will be jeopardizing their graduation. As well, this Incomplete standing will mean the student will be ineligible for Principal's List, Honor Roll or Honorable Mention status for their April report card. This could also have negative implications for university entrance and Passport to Education eligibility.

If you have not done so already, please see your GT advisor to book your interview as soon as possible. We are hoping to have as many of these done as we can before Spring Break. If you leave it to the last minute, there will be no guarantee we will be able to accommodate your GT interview before the April 15th deadline.

VIU Advising Appointments

DRAMA NEWS – Mr. Anderson & Ms. Schwarze North Island Regional Drama Festival

Fifty-two students from grade 9-12 represented the Performance Academy at the North Island Regional Drama Festival, affectionately known as NIRD. While adjudicator decisions had not been announced as the Newsletter deadline arrived, both the Junior play (an adaptation of *heARTS colour*, directed by Ms. Schwarze) and the Senior Play directed by Mr. Anderson were obvious audience favourites at the festival. Both plays received standing ovations. The Senior group wrote and performed *Status Update* and adaptation of Alexander Pope's satirical 18th century poem *Rape of the Lock*. They took the classic as a framework to satirize the modern obsession with technology and obviously connected with the audience, judging by the response.

How the adjudicators felt, we won't know until after the newsletter has gone to press. However, the students had a great learning experience, seeing 14 plays of wide ranging styles and historic significance and attending workshops in various aspects of the actor's and technician's craft. A great weekend for all involved, indeed!

START YOUR UNIVERSITY EDUCATION EARLY

Will you be in grade 12 next year and interested in earning University Credits while still in High School? You may be interested in the Vancouver Island University (VIU) Enrichment Courses. This opportunity is designed for students with high achievement and an interest in enhanced educational opportunities.

Q: What is the VIU Enrichment Program? This is a partnership that the School District has had for many years with VIU (formerly Malaspina) where students take university courses while still in high school.

Q: What kinds of courses are offered? Approximately 20 courses are offered to SD 68 grade students who are entering grade 12 in September 2011.

Q: How many courses can I take? Students may take up to two courses per semester.

Q: What is the application deadline? Your school counselor will receive Registration information in April 2011. Registration deadline will be Friday, June 10th, 2011. Watch for information in your school newsletter.

Q: What is the cost? Tuition, textbooks and fees cost approximately \$500. Some students may be sponsored for their tuition.
